Heavenly Garments

Put on the whole armor of God.

If prayer is believing God, (for without faith it is impossible to please him Heb 11:6) then believing God for his heavenly armor is of the utmost importance. Yet we find it is the least practiced of all the prayer disciplines. It is the one step that is most often overlooked, left out, or ignored all together. Perhaps that is because it is the least discovered truth in these disciplines.

Jesus told the parable of the man invited to a wedding banquet, who came ill dressed for the occasion. His evil was not his poverty, but his presumption to enter the King's palace without care for his appearance. Jesus similarly scold the church of Laodocia for the same fault, "Do you not know that you are naked... I counsel you to buy of me white raiment that the shame of your nakedness does not appear." (Rev. 3:18)

The fable "The Emperor's New Clothes" is one of my favorite children's stories for its moral is nearly biblical. Pretending, or better yet, presuming that you are clothed when you are in reality quite naked, is folly!

Someone recently asked a teacher on prayer whether one can lose his righteousness in Christ. Their position was "I am righteous automatically and permanently before God. Therefore I cannot lose my righteous standing even when I sin." What folly! It is as logical as the Emperor's imaginary clothes, to think that once dressed one never soils or needs to clean or freshen up his clothes. It stands in opposition to a vast array of Scriptures that urge us to confess sin and turn from wickedness or suffer God's discipline. Rev. 3:18 "I counsel you to buy white raiment that the shame of your nakedness does not appear" was written to Christians. We have no "teflon" righteousness to which sin cannot stick.

The apostle Paul echoes this truth again and again in the epistles. He cries, "Put off the old and put on the new" making it an obligation of saints to change clothes, exchanging our dirty, tattered garments for his provided robes of righteousness. Thus it cannot be presumed to be an automatic act of God for us. We must do it. We must reckon it to be so, thus putting on his provision of righteousness – our white garments. God provides them. We must put them on. This is the act of believing prayer.

There are two aspects to this act of "putting on" the Lord Jesus Christ:

One is positional, the other is practical. One is wear-fare, the other is warfare. One is believing, the other is receiving.

Positional Attire

Our positional garment is the act of reckoning what God has said as being so in heavenly realms. It is accepting God's truth at face value, and declaring his facts to be absolutely true for us.

With Regard To Sin

It begins with believing what God has said about our sins, that they are forgiven, atoned for, covered, cast into the sea, removed as far as the east from the west, forgotten, washed, blotted out, and never to be remembered again.

We cannot believe what God has said without first discovering it, then believing it to be true, and finally stating it, or declaring it to be fact. We need to know it, embrace it, and declare it. We need to hear from God himself (with our heart and ears) a loud "Not guilty!"

These are healing bandages of the soul. They need to be kept close at hand, and used often. I wrote them in the flyleaf of my Bible so as to never lose these truths. I recommend that you do the same, otherwise you will lose them, like misplaced glasses or the keys to your car. Memorizing them is even better so you can argue the case before demonic accusers. You have ten fingers. Let each one represent the Gospel gloves that cover your naked, bloodstained hands.

With Regard to Sonship

I have not only been forgiven, but have been transformed. All things have become new. My position before God is "accepted in the beloved." I am no longer a worm, an outcast, a foreigner, or stranger to God. I am a son! God has provided fitting clothing for a son of the King of Kings. Our titles are numerous. Our position shines untarnished for all to see. But again, we must discover our positional coverings and put them on by declaring them to be God's truth in heavenly realms.

I am not what I feel like I am. I am what God says I am. So I wear my sonship with pride. Declare your heritage! Let principalities and powers know who you are. You are known at the throne!
